David St. John Hodder, Ph.D., age 79, passed peacefully on Friday April 26, 2019 at Bryn Mawr Hospital with family by his side. He was the beloved husband of Dyane A. Mr. Hodder was a graduate of the Imperial College, University of London, with his degree in Aeronautical Engineering. He would go on to receive his doctorate from the University of Phoenix.
