Henry A. "Hal" Landoll III, age 69, husband of Virginia L. "Ginny" (Ivankovich) Landoll, of Malvern, PA, passed away on Saturday, February 15, 2020 at home. Born on October 21, 1950 in Sandusky, Ohio, he was the son of the late Henry A. Jr. and Carolyn (Grahl) Landoll.

Hal received his Bachelors degree from Bowling Green State University. He was an active member of the Great Valley Presbyterian Church in Malvern, PA. He retired after 40 years from the job he loved—director of sales for Nestle Purina, a pet food company he worked for since his graduation. Hal loved to travel, especially to Europe, and he and Ginny took several memorable trips with their friends after his retirement. He also enjoyed visiting wineries and choosing a nice bottle of wine to share around the table with family and friends.
