Mary L. Mitchell, age 85, wife of the late William Mitchell, of Douglassville, PA, passed away on Thursday, April 30, 2020 at Keystone Villa in Douglassville. Born on April 11, 1935 in Homestead, PA, she was the daughter of the late John P. and Agnes (Bresnai) Rock.

Mrs. Mitchell was a graduate of Pennsbury High School. She was employed as a medical records librarian for the State of Pennsylvania. She had worked at the Youth Development Center and Eastern State School and Hospital in Bucks County, followed by Pennhurst State School and Hospital and the Southeast Pennsylvania Veterans' Center in Spring City. Throughout her career, and beyond, her organizational skills rivaled that of just about anybody.
