Rev. Alexander Ortiz, 38, husband of Kimberly R. (Onifer) Ortiz, of Royersford, PA, formerly Jackson, NJ, passed away on Tuesday, July 28, 2009, in the Phoenixville Hospital. Born in Palisades Park, NJ, he was the son of Charles and Angela (Santiago) Ortiz, of Weehawken, NJ. Rev.
