



## Allan P. Wolfe Sr.

Allan P. "Skip" Wolfe, Sr., age 85, of Glenmoore, Pennsylvania, formerly Gulph Mills, Conshohocken and Chester County, passed away on Thursday morning, March 4, 2021 in his residence. Born on December 19, 1935 in Wayne, PA, Radnor Township, he was a son of the late Emma (Pennypacker) Hunter E. Wolfe.

Allan was graduate of Conshohocken High School, Class of 1954, where he played football. He served his country in the United States Navy from 1954 - 1958 active duty, and from 1958 - June 21, 1962, inactive reserves, when he was honorably discharged. He had been actively employed with several companies, some of which were, Devault Manufacturing, AC Miller Company, Warner Company and Howard E Trego to name a few. Allan has been a member of Hopewell United Methodist Church in Guthriesville and most recently Nantmeal United Methodist Church in Glenmoore.

Allan was active as a Coach with the Lionville Little League and also with Downingtown Babe Ruth Baseball. He was an avid gardener, enjoyed wildlife and watching birds and animals in his yard, and especially had a love for his dogs.

Mr. Wolfe is survived by his life partner of 30 years, Gladys Smith, of Glenmoore; his children: Allan P. Wolfe, Jr., and wife Anne, of Downingtown

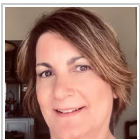
