Amy graduated with Honors from Rosemont College and Drexel University School of Law. She passed the PA Bar exam and was admitted to the PA Bar. In 2011, Amy went on to begin her practice when a rare brain tumor, the cells of which she carried from before she was born, began to grow and took everything from her. It was just as she was reaching her life-long dream to represent clients in Court.
