A graduate of Hartsville High School, Hartsville S.C., class of 1975, he moved to Phoenixville shortly thereafter.

Anthony was employed at John R Hollingsworth Co as a welder for many years and then began a tenure working for his older brother, Bobby, owner of Josey Janitorial Services. His health declined to the point where he became eligible for Social Security Disability and at that point he began staying home and taking care of his grandsons.
