Carl W. Daywalt, Jr., age 62, husband of Bernadette (Taylor) Daywalt, of Norristown, PA, passed away on Sunday, July 1, 2018 in the Einstein Medical Center Montgomery with his family by his side. Born on May 23, 1956 in Bryn Mawr, PA, he was a son of the Carl and Mae (Carter) Daywalt.
