Spending time with his family was most important to him and he made as much time for them as possible. He had a limitless, undying passion for his 1968 Plymouth Roadrunner and loved driving it around town. He will be remembered for his kind and loving heart. He always put his family and friends before himself and made sure everyone was well cared for in every aspect. He taught them to strive for the best and not to stop until they achieved their goals.
