It was so funny when the tape was played back we were all in stitches as to how many times people were asking for the gravy to be passed abck and forth.

When we were younger at Christmas time Aunt Elaine would give us Christmas ornaments from Hershey and every year they are always hung on our tree and are such a great memory!

I also remember when Uncle Bob and Aunt Elaine were having their home built in Berwyn. Aunt Elaine would stay at our home when she came to check to see how the house was coming along. She used to sleep in my bedroom and I would be so excited so see her. She was always so kind and a pleasure to be with.

When Aunt Elaine and Uncle Bob decided to move from Berwyn they announced they would be "upsizing" instead of "downsizing" in retirement and moving to Phoenixville. I was so excited because I

lived in Phoenixville. I would go and visit them and have a wonderful time. When I would go to Yeager's Farm and Market next to their home I would pick up corn, peaches, tomatoes etc. to bring to them.
