Elaine (Bond) Moore, age 84, wife of the late John K. Moore, Sr., of Pottsville, Pennsylvania, passed away on Tuesday, August 25, 2020 in Lehigh Valley Hospital Schuylkill. Born on January 28, 1936 in Bryn Mawr, she was a daughter of the late Anna L. (Barsby) and Henry H. Bond, Sr.

A graduate of Haverford High School, Class of 1953, Elaine dedicated her life to her home and family. She had been a member of the Kimberton Fire Co., where she had been active with the Ladies Auxiliary, was a former Den Mother for Cub Scout Troop 49 in Kimberton and volunteered with Kimberton Youth Athletic League. She was also a member of the American Legion Post 38 Auxiliary, Schuylkill Haven.
