Frederick "Doc" Colantuoni, age 74, husband of Theresa (Benedetto) Colantuoni, of Phoenixville, PA, died Monday, September 26, 2022 in Phoenixville Hospital. Born on January 21, 1948 in Nyack, NY, he was a son of the late Fred and Angele (Murray) Colantuoni.

Dr. Colantuoni was a 1984 graduate of Palmer College of Chiropractic in Davenport, IA. He went on to found and practice at the Delaware Valley Chiropractic Center. He honorably served as a Sergeant in the United States Army during the Vietnam War, being awarded numerous awards including the Silver Star and the Purple Heart for gallantry in action. Over the years, he worked tirelessly to assist veterans in need. Dr. Colantuoni was an avid vegetable gardener, enjoyed music and motorcycling, and loved his dogs and family pets over the years. His never-ending jokes and humor lead to constant laughter that will be missed.

In addition to his wife, Dr. Colantuoni is survived by one son, Paul M. Colantuoni of Pottstown, PA; one brother, James Colantuoni of New York; and his loving Poodle, Lou.
