Harold D. Williams Sr., age 77, husband of Connie F. (Yosko) Williams, of Royersford, Pennsylvania, passed away on Sunday, March 19, 2023 in the Pottstown Hospital. Born on October 9, 1945 in Norristown, he was a son of the late Virginia (Sharitz) and Raymond Williams.

Harold had been employed for around 15 years each, at both Synthane Taylor in Oaks and TJ Cope in Collegeville, until his retirement. He was also a longtime member of the Polish Club and the Friendship Fire Co, both in Phoenixville.

A simple man, Harold enjoyed telling jokes to lighten the mood. He was quite the character who could always be counted on for a one-liner and had a nickname for everyone.
