June 10, 1945 - July 23, 2019

Harry A. Johnson, age 74, husband of Laurie A. (Smith) Johnson, of Phoenixville, PA, passed away on Tuesday, July 23, 2019 in the Phoenixville Hospital. Born on June 10, 1945 in Philadelphia, PA, he was a son of the late Howard L. and Mary J. (Stovall) Johnson.

Mr. Johnson proudly served in the United States Marine Corps during the Vietnam War. Aside from his children, his military service was his greatest life accomplishment. He was an avid shortwave radio and CB radio user, having multiple radios he would listen to and communicate through. Mr. Johnson was also a huge fan of Motown and classic rock music. Throughout his career, Mr. Johnson held several positions. He had worked as a security guard at the Montgomery Hospital in the early 1980s, a job he loved and connected him with his wife. He would also find joy working as, among other positions, a lab assistant for Rohrer Pharmaceuticals. More recently, he had been driving for Krapf Bus Company.

In addition to his wife, Mr. Johnson is survived by three children, Ryan A. Johnson of Phoenixville, PA, Alexa N. Johnson of Pittsburgh, PA, and Marissa A. Johnson of Malvern, PA; one sister, Nancy L. Fletcher of Norristown, PA; and a host of many beloved nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by one sister, Mary L. Etheredge.
