Henry C. Chmielefski, Jr., age 37, partner of Joshua Blackwood, of Royersford, PA, passed away on Sunday, May 20, 2018 in Rochester, NY. Born on April 4, 1981 in Upper Darby, Pennsylvania, he was a son of the late LuAnn M. (Gunnella) Chmielefski and Henry C. Sr., husband of Jerrienne Chmielefski of Collegeville, PA.

Henry was a graduate of Spring-Ford High School, class of 2000, where he was very involved with the percussion section of the marching band. He had worked for the Limerick Diner, the Sony store in Limerick, PA, Allied Wire and Cable in Collegeville, Pa, and most recently he worked at Spectrum Cable Corp. in Rochester, NY. 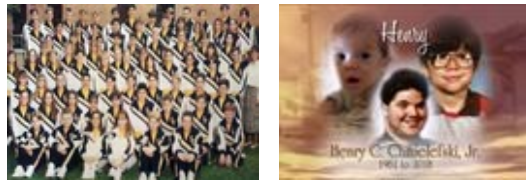
