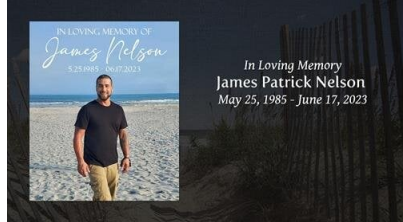

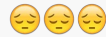
In parting, jP hated doing concrete steps, at 1st couldn't form them and
