



## Jane Cattermole

April 3, 1923 - April 9, 2012

Jane (Ried) Cattermole, age 89, wife of the late Rev. Richard A. Cattermole, of Wernersville, PA died Monday afternoon, April 9, 2012 in the Phoebe Berks Health Care Center, Wernersville, PA. Born in West Conshohocken, PA, she was a daughter of the late Robert R. and Anna L. (Clifford) Ried. Mrs. Cattermole was a graduate of the West Conshohocken High School, and attended the Philadelphia Bible College. Mrs. Cattermole worked for many years as the financial secretary for the European Christian Mission. She was also an assistant for the Global Ministries Office of the Evangelical Congregational Church. Mrs. Cattermole also was a well known public speaker. She was a supporter of the Christian Endeavor Society. She enjoyed writing Sunday School Materials which were used to support ministries around the world. Mrs. Cattermole is survived by two daughters: Ruth C., wife of Brian R. Jackins, of Elverson, PA; Lois C., wife of Patrick K. Wade, of Leesport, PA; six grandchildren; and one great-granddaughter.
