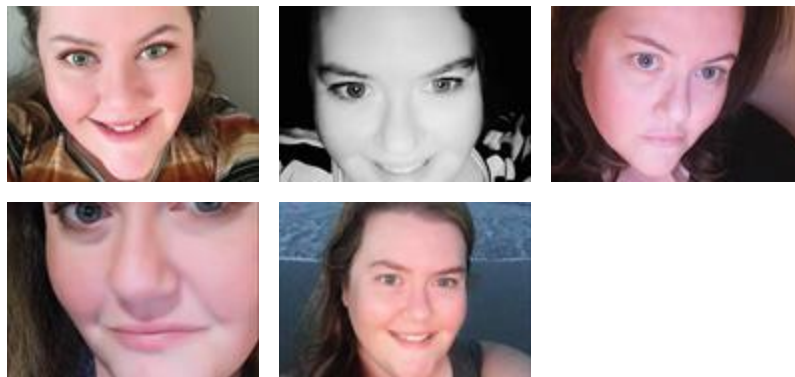

She was my reason for waking up every day. The love I have for her is infinite and immeasurable. The world will NEVER see anyone of her likeness or caliber again.

*Jessica was the most loving, kindhearted, friendly, brave, and wonderful person I've ever met. She was not only my wife but my best friend. She was my everything. Her outgoing personality made her so easy to talk to and she adapted easily to my family and our quirks. She so quickly became one of us. I have never felt comfort like I have listening to her warm voice. She was so trusting, respectful, and always made everyone feel welcome.*

*I am so much of a better person having met her. I cannot repay that enough. She taught me to be more polite, patient, outgoing, and friendly. She has left a hole in me no one could ever fill. I will do my best every day to be worthy of her.*

*To my dearest beloved Jessica (my Sugar Plum) – I love you more than words can express. I could never have endured one one thousandth of what you did. You're the strongest person I've ever met.
