John W. Manney, age 99, husband of Helen (Spieth) Manney, of Phoenixville, PA, passed away on Thursday, March 28, 2019 in the Seasons Hospice, Phoenixville. Born on January 28, 1920 in Phoenixville, he was a son of the late Walter and Aimee (Geiser) Manney.

Mr. Manney was a member of the 644th Tank Destroyer Battalion, serving at the Battle of the Bulge during World War II.
