Joseph W. Duddy, Jr., 72, died early Tuesday morning, Feb. 22, 2011, in Rittenhouse Pine Center, Norristown, PA, following a brief illness. Duddy, a Norristown native, lived most of his life in Montgomery County except for a stint in the U.S. Air Force. He most recently worked for Montgomery County as a security guard working in the courthouse, library and the former Sacred Heart Hospital.
