Joseph M. "Mickey" Brango, age 58, husband of the late Desiree (McConnell) Brango, of Phoenixville, PA, formerly of Douglassville, PA, died Thursday morning, May 8th, 2008 in the Phoenixville Hospital. Born in Phoenixville, he was a son of the late Joseph John and Ruth (Elam) Brango. He was a 1966 graduate of the Phoenixville High School. He was the lead singer of the band "Chain Reaction" that played in nightclubs in the Phoenixville, Pottstown, Norristown and surrounding areas in the 1970's. He was a master carpenter and worked for Frank Geiser in Phoenixville until his illness with Multiple Sclerosis prevented him from working.

Mr. Brango is survived by one daughter; Jaimee L. Brango, of Bethlehem, one brother; Harry Brango, of Royersford, one sister; Candice Brango, of Birdsboro.
