June 25, 1949 - April 18, 2023

Leonard A. Feehan, age 73, loving husband of Barbara L. (Scull) Feehan, of Phoenixville, Pennsylvania, passed away on Tuesday, April 18, 2023 at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania. He was surrounded by his wife and two daughters. Born on June 25, 1949, in Darby, Pennsylvania, Len was the son of the late Lenore R. (Finley) Rawding and George J. Feehan.

Len was a Class of 1967 graduate of Cardinal O'Hara High School before attending Fairleigh Dickinson University. He started his own marketing communications business, Leonard Feehan Associates, in 1987. Len's success came from his hard work and entrepreneurial spirit, as well as the daily support and partnership of his wife. Len worked from home for the majority of his career, allowing him to spend each day with his wife and attend all of his daughters' school events and track and cross country races.

Len was adventurous and full of curiosity. He loved exploring new places and taking family vacations with his wife and daughters. He inherited a passion for the Phillies and the Eagles from his father. He was able to experience "Bedlam at the Bank" at his last Phillies game in October 2022, which he said was the greatest sports experience of his life. Len also loved Broadway musicals and plays and watching movies and documentaries.

Len would do anything to help others. He volunteered his time at SCORE

(The Service Corps of Retired Executives) as a mentor for entrepreneurs, where he was recently honored for the time and value he gave to his mentees. Len always enjoyed making others laugh, and his life was filled with laughter until the very end. More than anything else, Len was a proud husband, father, and grandfather. His wife, Barbara, was his best friend, and they loved spending every day together. Anyone who knew Len knew about his daughters, as he proudly shared their accomplishments with anyone who would listen. He loved cheering for his daughters and son-in-law in their running races and supporting them in their professional careers. His greatest joy in life was when he became a "PoPi" to his three granddaughters, who filled his heart with so much love and happiness. Family was always the most important thing to Len.

In addition to his devoted wife of 40 years, Len is survived by his daughters: Megan K. Feehan and Lauren M. (Feehan) Gordon, wife of Eli H. Gordon; granddaughters: Elenore "CiCi", Alice, and Vivienne Gordon; siblings: George J. Feehan III, Thomas J. Feehan and Mary Feehan Doherty and their spouses; and many nieces and nephews.

“ In 2004 my wife Patricia, Barbara's sister, and I flew to New Jersey and purchased a 51 foot sailboat. We scheduled to have it loaded on a special trailer and delivered to California. This was a major event for us and we were very excited about getting to watch it get loaded and head out for the other side of the country. We returned on the scheduled date to discover that the trucking company had postponed the event without notifying us. We were very disappointed to not be able to witness our new "pride and joy" head for her new home and our feelings were multiplied because we were not going to be able to make a second trip for the as-yet-unknown load and haul date. Patricia had contacted Len and Barbara and invited them to meet with us for the event but had to call them and let them know it was off.

Barbara suggested that we meet them at New Hope for lunch. We toured the town together and went for lunch at a restaurant that had been there since the Revolutionary War. It was a great day and made the trip worth the effort! During lunch, Len and Barbara ask a lot of questions about the boat and the rig down and loading of it for transport. I remember they specifically ask for the name of the trucking company. I also remember a fleeting thought wondering why they would care.

We ended up putting off the delivery until the following spring due to weather. The day for the load up and departure finally came. We were again disappointed that we could not be there. It took two weeks to get to California due in part to oversize load travel restrictions. I called the driver every evening to check progress. On one call he ask if we got our surprise yet. I replied that we had not but wondered about what it might be. Finally he arrived and asked again about the surprise. When we asked him about it he just said "You will find out soon, and you will like it".

A couple of days later Patricia got a package in the mail from Barbara and Len. When we opened it we were totally ecstatic to find a VHS tape that Len and family made of the rig down and loading of

our boat on the trailer and of her heading out the gate of the New Jersey marina for her new home! It seems like Len was planning it while we were eating lunch and that is why he asked so many questions. He took Barbara and Megan and spent the entire (exhausting) day at the marina filming the whole process. Len and Barbara even interviewed the original owner who had come to see the boat head for her new life. They even added background music!

Len showed so much thought and care for Patricia and me, and it touched us so deeply that he would think of us and put himself and his family through that long day of filming the event for us, that it made us both cry. We still can't tell the story or watch the tape without feeling a sense of deep gratitude. Thank you Len for being such a thoughtful and caring man! I feel like a richer man for knowing Len and am sorry not to be able to share more time with him.
