Mary Valencia (Hinchey) Marrella, age 94, wife of the late Joseph C. Marrella, of Limerick, passed away on Wednesday, September 29, 2021 in Phoenixville Hospital. Born on January 13, 1927 in Bryn Mawr, she was the daughter of the late Kathryn (Soley) and John Hinchey.

Valencia was employed in mortgage processing for Bryn Mawr Trust until her retirement. She had been a devoted member of Good Shepherd Church, Rosemont, and then Epiphany Church, Royersford. For many years, Valencia was a member of the Woman's Club of Royersford. In her spare time, she was an avid reader and loved baking.
