Michael P. Fullam, age 64, husband of the late Kathleen A. (Kelly) Fullam, of Phoenixville, PA, passed away on Thursday, July 8, 2021 in the Bryn Mawr Hospital. Born on August 27, 1956 in Brooklyn, NY, he was a son of James R. Fullam of Hilton Head Island, SC and the late Joan M. (Dillman) Fullam.

Mr. Fullam was a graduate of Archbishop Carroll High School in Radnor, PA. He attended Georgetown University for three years, receiving his varsity letters in soccer and lacrosse, before receiving his Bachelor's degree from Villanova University. Mr. Fullam worked in corporate training and education, spending a total of 32 years working for Chrysler. Half-way through his time at Chrysler, he took a pause while he earned his Master's degree in Education from the Penn State University. This led to a short career as a social studies teacher at St. Gabriel's Hall in Audubon, before finishing out his final 16 years at Chrysler. More recently, he was the Vice President of Client Services for the Catholic Leadership Institute in Malvern, PA, and was currently the Director of Program Development for the National Automobile Dealers Association (NADA).

Mr. Fullam previously coached the soccer team at Phoenixville Area High School from 1991-1999. He was an avid fan of the Chelsea Football Club and loved watching the matches with his sons and brothers. In his spare time, he enjoyed playing the guitar and the bass, as well as singing and songwriting.

He was a member of the Nashville Songwriters' Association and the Gospel Music Association, having recently released his own Christian music album. Most important to him was his family, and his grandchildren were the focus of his life.

Mr. Fullam is survived by three children, Daniel P., husband of Laurie Fullam of Royersford, PA, Josh M., husband of Sarah Fullam of Pottsgrove, PA, and Jenna E., wife of Ben Silber of Collegeville, PA; seven grandchildren, McKenna (13), Collin (11), Finnegan (8), Maguire (5), Emmeline (7), Sloane (2), Sasha (7 mo.); five siblings, Timothy J., husband of Kate Fullam of Chester Springs, PA, Patrick K., husband of Joann Fullam of Coatesville, PA, Kevin P., husband of Cathy Fullam of Warminster, PA, Thomas S., husband of Maryann Fullam of West Brandywine, PA, and Coleen A., wife of Steven Hillman of Devon, PA; and nine nieces and nephews, Stephen, Mallory, Julianna, Michelle, Nathan, Samantha, Joseph, Zachary, and Olivia.

“Michael Fullam was a funny, kind, compassionate spirit. He had a way of adding a level of comfort when he would enter a room. It was a joy to work with Michael. I had a good feeling about him immediately. Early in our work interactions; Michael quietly said, “I’m praying for you.” He clearly noticed a time of challenge for me and was willing to extend an expression of comfort. There are some people who give off a feeling of authentically good intentions. Michael was one of those people. His laugh had a voluminous quality capable of lifting the spirits of anyone within listening distance. I’d chuckle whenever he would say the word schedule. He’d pronounce it more like “shed-yool” (a British pronunciation). His quality as a gentleman was unparalleled, even in a work setting. Michael had a habit of standing anytime a woman entered the room. It did not matter if it was someone he reported to, someone who reported to him, or someone on the same level at work. Deeply ingrained in Michael was a desire to treat people with a level of respect beyond that of a higher standard. Whenever Michael taught a class, the participants would be fully engaged. I believe the class participants could sense who he was at his core. I’m particularly fond of a story that he shared with a class about explaining the difference between a natural introvert and a natural extrovert. I dare not attempt to do the story justice. Suffice to say, while visiting Washington, D.C., that the story ended explaining how Michael witnessed his wife sitting with a woman on a park bench. They were laughing and having a vibrant conversation. Michael discovered that not only did his wife and the woman just meet that day, they spoke different languages. The woman was from a different country visiting. Yet, they found a way to communicate. It was a lovely story. I was looking forward to hearing more stories – particularly the story of the broken schoolhouse chair that Michael would keep at his desk. I would not have believed that I would not hear that story. Somehow, I thought we had more time. My prayers are with you and your family. May the Lord keep you in the palm of His hands.

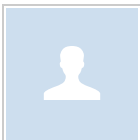
