I am not sure if this is the same Nancy but the description fits by age, location and interest in art. My mother was born around the same time in the Irwin area of Westmoreland County and family lore suggests Nancy was related to the Robertshaws who owned Robertshaw Controls in New Stanton PA. The Tomajko family owned coal mines in nearby Edna PA, named the Adamsburg Coal Company, and their home was eventually named the Adams House which became a banquet hall later, then sadly was destroyed by fire.
