Patricia Ann Quay, 76, of Spring City, passed away on Wednesday, April 2, 2014, in the Thomas Jefferson University Hospital, Philadelphia. Born at home in Linfield, she was a daughter of the late Earl R. Quay and the late Eva (Fry) Stewart.

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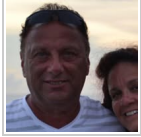

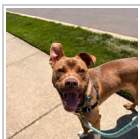

“ When I was a kid, we moved around a lot. My Dad is a Marine, and so, he was transferred to lots of places. When I was 12, we moved from Scottsville, NY to Oceanside, CA. On the way, we stopped to visit with my Aunt Pat. She showed us an awesome time, and clearly loved us a lot. I don't remember everything from that trip, but I remember us making an awesome mixed tape. I wish someone had that tape because I had such a fun time making it. It was the last stop before my new reality, and Aunt Pat made it a great one. We had a song that represented different moments of the trip. We got to experience the "old west," Arizona style. Different then anything we had ever known living on the East coast, but she seemed at home there.

She was also one of the women I look back on my life and consider a "strong woman" who was probably one of the first representations of feminism for me. I don't think I knew it at the time, because I didn't really understand these concepts until I went to college, really. She embodied independence and survival. She took care of herself and her sons. She told me, often, that I needed to believe in myself. That no one else would do it for me. That I was a strong person, and that I could be anything I wanted. She helped me believe in me. Moments where others were not supportive, she would take me aside and tell me to be me. Do what was right for me. I will always treasure that advice from her.

She was of the same stock as my grandmother, who raised 13 kids; had a hard life but never complained. Aunt Pat was the oldest of the 13. They were strong women. Loved their family. Weathered the storms. I can only hope for that strength in hard times. That my children will one day know the strong stock that they come from, and will embrace that strength, live by that code and represent them well.

I will always remember sun-kissed Aunt Pat, hair pulled back in a ponytail. Free spirit. Deep love. Sitting in a chair by the pool in Arizona. Big smile, full-bodied laugh, and a woman that always

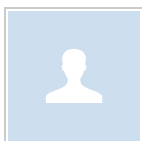
*loved us very much.*

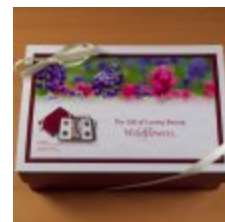

We became roommates , sharing an apartment for a while, both being ready to leave our relationships @ the same time. We went shopping together , went out dancing together, and would watch old movies on rainy weekend days while feasting on home made cookies and hot chocolate.

One of my most cherished memories of mom as my friend was helping her prepare to take the GED test so she could gain entry into college. She was an incredibly intelligent woman but the concepts of algebra confounded her. She was also extremely stubborn and refused to accept the concept of the value "X" to represent any number. After many intense discussions, and great loss of hair (mine) she was able to grasp the concept and went on to pass her tests with flying colors.

I have not lived close to her for close to 30 years, having lived in Phoenix and now Portland but we remained very close and visited each other as we could. We also spoke on the phone frequently.

These calls would be lengthy and occurred weekly. If by chance I did not call her for longer then a week, she would call me and

*immediately upon finding out I was ok, chastise me for not calling. We stayed apprised of all goings on in each other's life and were often planning our next get together.*

*I have not been able to speak with Mom on the phone since she entered the hospital and I still sometimes wake up and think to myself ,I need to call Mom today as it's been too long since we've talked. Then I clear the sleep from my head and realize why we haven't spoke and I'm so saddened. I miss you terribly Mom, my best friend.*
