Paul R. Kocher, 91, husband of the late Helen E. (Westcott) Kocher, of Royersford, passed away on Saturday, April 24, 2010, in the Phoenixville Hospital. Born in Easton, he was a son of the late Paul R. and Estella (Conahay) Kocher. Mr. Kocher was a graduate of Easton High School. He served 16 years in the United States Navy, serving aboard Air Craft Carriers, such as the USS Lexington, USS Yorktown, USS Saratoga, USS Antietam, USS Oriskany, and others. He went on to graduate from West Chester College and the Naval School of Music. Mr. Kocher taught world cultures for about 20 years at the Great Valley School District. He served as the president of the Spring City Borough Council for many years and served on the board of the Spring City Library. Mr. Kocher was a member of the Spring City American Legion and the Tall Cedars of Lebanon Spring City Forest 34. In his retirement he traveled extensively throughout the US in his RV.
