



## Paul W. Wright

May 17, 1953 - March 5, 2018

Paul W. Wright, age 64, Norristown, PA, died Monday, March 5, 2018 in Thomas Jefferson University Hospital, Philadelphia, PA after a very brief battle with cancer. Born on May 17, 1953 in Beverly, Massachusetts, he was a son of Virginia (Green) Wright, of Audubon, PA and the late James G. Wright. He was a 1971 graduate of the Methacton High School. Paul worked as a Machine Operator for Superior Tube in Collegeville, PA until his recent illness.

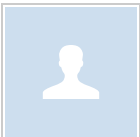
