Randy D. Fronheiser, 52, of Elverson, passed away on Saturday, November 7, 2009, in the Reading Hospital. Born in Pottstown, he was a son of the late Wilmer H. Fronheiser, and Velma F. (Ebersole) Fronheiser, of Phoenixville. Mr. Fronheiser was a 1974 graduate of Great Valley High School and served in the United States Navy. He was currently employed as the assistant manager at Walmart in Exton and previously was employed at Sherwin-Williams in the Gateway Shopping Center in Valley Forge and in Thorndale. An avid bowler, Randy bowled in a league at Plaza Bowling in Downingtown. He enjoyed refinishing oak furniture and collectibles, especially plates, Franklin Mint, matchbox and old toys.
