But...at the same time, coming to know how difficult it was for Rhonda, a warm, wonderful person.. Memory two...Watching my teenager get on the Amtrak train all by herself to meet Rhonda, Steve, and other family members. So brave. I was so happy for both of them, and so proud of Emily.. Memory three. Meeting Rhonda and Steve at Emily's graduation from High School. What a joy to meet Emily's other mother, and have other important family members meet her as well.....the person who had brought such joy and fulfillment to our family at her own expense. Memory 4. Emily getting to spend time with Rhonda the night before Emily and Derek's wedding, at the hotel they were both staying at...how fitting that it should be on that occasion. Memory 5.. The wedding again. Me dancing with Rhonda...the two mothers dancing together...I have a photo of this.. Memory 6...this still annoys me...I had asked he D.J at the wedding to play "Hello", the song by Lionel Richie that Rhonda, had told me was her favorite, at the time Emily was born. They didn't, and I am still annoyed at myself that I didn't say anything to the d.j. about that. Memory 7 At least knowing that Rhonda and Emily had met and had a relationship, even though they seldom saw each other (we don't see her as much as we would like to either, given that Em lives in England), but knowing that they do keep in touch. And, I am so glad that Rhonda at least knew and felt joy about the impending birth of her granddaughter, name yet to be revealed to me.
I know that Emily is heartbroken about the loss, and Art and I send heartfelt sympathy to Steve, and he rest of the family. I do think Emily has had and is having a happy life...We are so proud of the kind person she is, and we are so pleased at her marrying the most wonderful young man one could imagine, and so pleased at all she has achieved...she is a talented person, artistic, and has done so well at her career, starting as a star student both in high school and

college as a stage manager, a passion of hers, and moving on to travel the world with her team, for weeks at a time to several different countries,, supervising installations .of Madame Tussaud's Wax Museum displays, her current job..

Emily is a loving big sister to her brother David, now age 27. He adores her and ,misses her, given that she lives so far away.
