Robert J. Connelly, age 68, loving husband of June L. (Faust) Connelly, of Collegeville, Pennsylvania, passed away on Saturday, October 10, 2020. Born on September 25, 1952 in Pottstown, he was a son of the late Grace A. (Wagner) and John J. Connelly, Jr.

A 1970 graduate of Spring-Ford High School, Bob received his Bachelors of Science degree in Biology from Pennsylvania State University in 1974. He had been employed for many years as a program security specialist for Lockheed Martin. In addition, he volunteered with the Friendship Fire Department and Ambulance in Royersford and the Trappe Fire and Ambulance.

Bob was very easy going and enjoyed the simple things in life. He especially loved being outdoors, and in years past, loved hunting with his father and family. 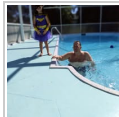

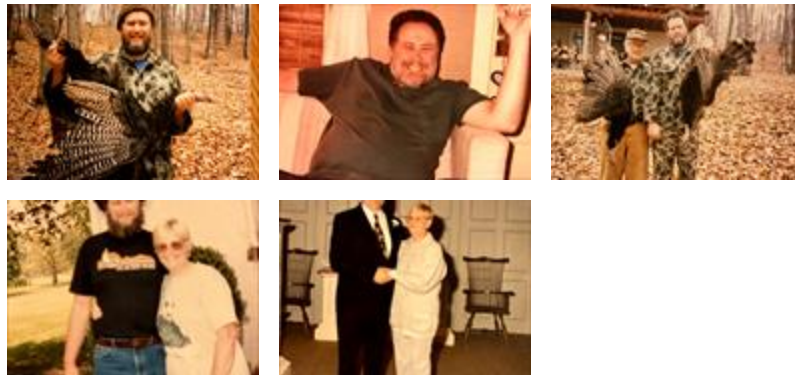
