Rodney R. Farris, husband of the late Nancy J. Farris, of Boyertown, PA, passed away on Sunday, October 4, 2015 at home. Born in Middletown, OH, he was a son of Linda (Dennis) Farris of Middletown, OH and the late Virgil Farris.

Mr. Farris graduated from Middletown High School. Following graduation, he immediately joined the United States Air Force, where he traveled the world extensively as an aircraft mechanic.
