Ronald H. Artiles, age 74, of Plainfield, NJ, passed away on Monday, January 10, 2022 in the Morristown Medical Center, Morristown, NJ. Born on July 7, 1947 in Philadelphia, PA, he was a son of the late Anibal and Anna Marie (Barrella) Artiles.

Mr. Artiles honorably served in the United States Navy during the Vietnam War. He was a graduate of North Catholic High School in Philadelphia. 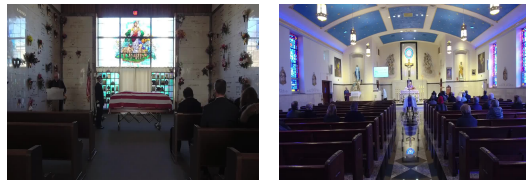
