Ronald Nonamaker Sr., age 84, husband of the late Joyce E. (Carl) Nonamaker, of Linfield, Pennsylvania, passed away on Thursday, December 23, 2021 in the Pottstown Hospital - Tower Health after an illness.

Born on August 15, 1937 in Philadelphia, he was the son of the late Gertrude I. (Goodyear) and Warren J. Nonamaker.

A graduate of Spring-Ford High School, Ronald was the owner and operator of Nonamaker's Garage in Linfield, in which his hard work made for a successful business.
