Sandra D. (Davey) Wengert, 65, of Skippack, passed away on Monday, December 29, 2008, in the Mercy Suburban Hospital. Born in Philadelphia, she was a daughter of the late Charles J. and Edna R. Mrs. Wengert was a 1961 graduate of Spring-Ford High School, received a B.S. in Elementary Education from Kutztown State College, and received a Masters in Education from Rosemont Masters Technical Ed.
