Terry R. Piersol, 74, longtime resident of Royersford, PA died unexpectedly on Thursday, February 4, 2021. Son of the late Claire M. and Mervyn H. Piersol, Terry spent his formative years in Elverson-- a proud Eagle Scout and graduate of Owen J. Roberts H.S. After earning his B.A. at Gettysburg College in 1968, Terry started his career in banking and 20 year tenure with U.S. Army Reserve.
