Victor E. DeWees, age 82, husband of the late Mary Jane (Smith) DeWees of Limerick, Pennsylvania, passed away on Saturday, November 25, 2023 in his residence. Born on March 1, 1941, in Colledgeville, he was a son of the late Anna M. (Ewing) Denner.

Victor was an owner/operator over the road truck driver for 65 years. He leased his truck to and was employed for 38 years by Elite Services. He had been a member of the Teamsters Union and United Steelworkers GMP Local 132, and for over 20 years, drove exclusively for the Spring City Electrical Manufacturing. Victor had over 6 million miles logged from driving almost every road in the United States. He could give anyone directions for anywhere they wanted to go.
