William W. Meredith, 94, of West Chester, formerly South Coventry, passed away on Thursday evening, October 11, 2012, in the Pembroke Health and Rehabilitation Residence. He was the husband of 72 years to Mildred (Brown) Meredith, who passed away on September 23. Born in Modena, Chester County, PA, he was a son of the late Benjamin and Florence (Townesley) Meredith. Mr. Meredith served in the United States Navy during World War II aboard the USS Jaccard taking part in the liberation of the Philippines.
